




• MAIN CHARACTER & STORY •

Rani's main rival is Emperor Humayun, the Mughal ruler who is bent on conquering Rani's kingdom for her trading routes. His army has been unstoppable and kills or enslaves everyone in its path.

Then Rani is approached by the Goddess of War, she learns that Humayun has access to a magical Tree of Power which grants his kingdom mystical help. Rani vows to destroy the Tree so it may never be used for destruction again.

All the while, Rani is aware that her husband, the former king, was murdered. She must find the killer or be susceptible to a similar attack. Her Queenship revolves around the interests of the few vs. the interests of the many. The feudal lords have their interests that must be balanced with the interests of the people as a whole.

he show feels dark, mysterious and cerebral. Instead of "good conquers evil," the dominating theme is, "evil consumes good."


It is a murder mystery that presents serious dilemmas.

nanna is the Goddess of War. Her goal is to purge the world of evil.

She has chosen Rani to be her ally as she tries to rid the earth of demons who have allied with the Mughals.

While Inanna's strategies are more violent than the merciful Rani, Innana goes from trusting of Rani's character to skeptical as Rani delves into anti-heroism.



• CHARACTERS • Uma

Queen before Rani took the throne, and her assistance to Rani is motivated by her desire to further her legacy.

While Rani trusts her, Uma teaches Rani that she must make difficult decisions that go against Rani's morals.

Uma knows a secret that will haunt Rani and force Rani into an impossible decision.





The Battle of the Haldighati Pass

As Rani investigates the murder of her husband, she gains new allies in her war with the Mughal Empire. She creates an alliance with the Vijayanagara Empire and brings one of their princes into her army, a move designed to protect her kingdom. The alliance backfires because it sows dissent within her own ranks. Rani builds an army of lady warriors to help fight Mahi.

Rani Builds Her Infrastructure and Her Army

While Rani has survived the first onslaught, she knows her survival will be short-lived if she does not expand her kingdom. She begins a campaign to rebuild her country's trade of tea, spices, indigo dye, ships, textiles, and war horses. In order to do so, she must get the people in her kingdom on board with embracing, as workers, the untouchables: the lowest caste in Indian society. She uses her trade to bolster her army with cannons, mercenaries, and other tools of war.





Rise of Sher Shah, a New Enemy for Rani

Rani's attack on the Mughals has deposed Humayun, but now Sher Shah and his dangerous, nomadic army have taken Agra. Sher Shah puts a bounty on Humayun's head to prevent any overthrow. Paradoxically, when the assassination attempt fails, Humayun realizes that he must take back his kingdom if he is going to have any semblance of safety in his life.

Rani Defeats Sher Shah

Rani learns Uma's dark secret, yet refuses to kill her own mother. Rani has Uma carry out secret missions. She starts to get Uma to do the dirty jobs that she does not want to be known for. Uma tries to warn Rani against these missions, but it is to no avail. Rani begins a campaign of sabotage of Sher Shah's trade and steals his war elephants to use against him. Humayun begins reconquering his land.





Rani's War Tactics Turn Ugly, Civil War Erupts

Through Uma, Rani begins to wage war on Zamindars (Mughal tax collectors) which is seen as an attack on civilians. When people find out, Rani scapegoats her mother. Inside Rani's kingdom, Tarun allies with religious leaders to begin a civil war against Rani for control of the kingdom.

Rani Controls the Tree of Power

Rani has defeated Humayun and taken the remains of the Tree of Power. Now, Humayun is hell-bent on recovering the remains in Rani's kingdom. Rani has built her empire but now is corrupt. She now believes that her conquests were purging of the sins of the conquered and that she was "the punishment of God." She has betrayed her mother and her son is now fighting age, and she goes on to betray him as well. She sends her troops on suicide missions to provoke other kingdoms.
