
SUNTES

MAIN CHARACTER

Loose Eddie, the style-forward sensation of "The 1419," conceals a sinister mind beneath a glamorous exterior. A silent killer, they relish the slow and calculated execution of their diabolical plans, adding a chilling layer to the group dynamics.







N***a James

RECURRING CHARACTER

N***a James is the most famous cowboy in all of Baltimore. He is considered a legend by many and a hero by all. He is a trigger-happy ladies' man who usually gets the credit for Arthur's work, while Arthur gets the bad rap for everything that gets destroyed.

N***a James is a very mysterious man, and above all else, he wants to keep his secrets a secret.



WHAT'S NEXT

The 1419 find themselves back together again after an undetermined amount of time since their last escapade. They have resolved many of their differences and all find common ground in a shared enemy: Rufus and the good boys.

At some point, we get a history lesson, an education on how we got to 2041 in Baltimore, and how and why the 1419 was formed. Lady Elaine will discover that Rufus killed her parents, and the 1419 will discover that Rufus is the Chief of Police. Rufus will use many back channels and contract many hitmen and their teams to attempt to destroy the 1419. Ultimately, to the shock of anyone watching, they will prevail.

THE COLEMAN BROTHERS

The brothers were born and raised in Baltimore, MD, and made their way to LA through music. They grew from teenage beat makers into full-blown pop songwriting super producers. Between the two of them, they are responsible for creating the biggest hits of this decade for stars like Katy Perry, Nicki Minaj, Maroon 5, Beyoncé, Britney Spears, and more. Their music has also graced films like "Suicide Squad," "Venom," "Crazy Rich Asians," and the number one comedy song of all time, "Freaky Friday" by Lil Dicky, along with various others by The Lonely Island. Now, they've joined comedic and musical minds to create their first animated comedy series, "The 1419," based on the six legendary neighborhood cowboy vigilantes of Baltimore's post-apocalyptic East Side.

TONE

The series is set in an urban city that has been more or less destroyed by violence and fire. Many of the citizens have reverted to the ways of the old west: horses, hunting, tribes. 
